Conference theme

Since ENHR was last in Scotland 20 years ago, much has changed. Scotland has regained its own [Parliament](#) and has adopted the strongest [legal framework for homeless people](#) in the world. In September 2014 Scotland will hold a [referendum on independence](#) – sparking a debate that is central to the theme of the conference: *Beyond Globalisation: remaking housing policy in a complex world.*
